


#### **Paint the Street**

Find a blank space. Any blank concrete surface is fair game.






#### Share wifi downtown

## Shovel snow downtown




#### **String Lights**

You can plant native wildflowers on any unmaintained dirt areas downtown





Staircase Murals If you have an open staircase downtown like the one above, why not paint a staircase mural?




### Adopt downtown planters



Display quilts or any fabric arts on a railing.




#### **Paint your Crosswalks**
